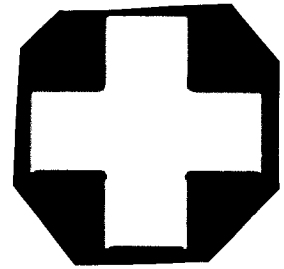


Scene Size-up



- Is there any danger to patrollers on scene?, such as blizzard conditions
Steep terrain (Widow-maker, Cliffs Cliff, 4, 3, Spruce run / Pallisades cliff, Mountain view headwall of lower 4)
Avalanche, (at big tupper?)
Flooding.
- Traffic (cats, skiers, snowboarders, Sir-rides-alot)
- Live wires (trails 1 and 2) lighting stikes.
- Hazzard chemicals, fumes
- Structural colapses (light towers, snowmaking Building on trail 1) *Mid-way summit chair 1*
- falling from an insecure location (skiers left side of wraparound, cliffs cliff, 3, 4, widow-maker
skiers left on some sides of lift line)
- Dangerous annimals in the area (humpback whales, big cats, coy dogs)
- # of patients
- will you have difficulty reaching the patients (same trails for falling from an insecure location)
Can you reach them with emrgency care equipment? can you get to them with a backboard or sled?
- will you need to untangle them (ropes, trees)

-is additional help needed? (channel 2, Channel 1 for ambulance)

-what has probably occurred? does the patient have an injury or illness? what is the probable mechanism of injury?

- Is the patient responsive or possibly unresponsive? (A.V.P.U.)

-Is the patient breathing? Talking? (A.V.P.U.)

-Is there obvious bleeding? Is the general impression poor? (does the subject appear to be critically injured or ill?)

(MOI/ NOI)

- Body substance isolation
- scene safety
- determine # of patients
- Request additional assistance
- Consider C-spine immobilization

(A.V.P.U.)

- Alert
- verbal
- pain
- unresponsive
